Mr. Cross,

I must admit when reading "quick "reply all" response once again" and then the close with "I probably look at about one out of fifteen or twenty of your emails" does imply an unwillingness toward dialog and reconciliation. You once agreed that my exposition of the Lord's command for us to reconcile was correct and wanted to do so. However, you have also stated that you are unwilling to communicate with me. Do you see a problem here?

You are right that Scripture speaks of our treasure and our heart. From the little I have from you on this there seems to be a sense of my treasure, or funds, must be sent blindly to a family that refuses to communicate with me or share in the struggle for obedience toward the Lord. However, as I read passages like Luke 12 I get a different sense. Luke seems to point toward obedience to the Lord first and a trust in the Lord for our daily bread. Are you willing to review this with me?

As to "Actions speak louder than words", consider both from the willingness to dialog and the funds issue. Simply using the recent phone call example we are at 80+ unanswered, verses a barrage of emails, calls, and videos. The "inaction" does not seem to be with me on this. When it comes to funds, you were the one who suggested that my wife come up with a list of things to consider in August. A list was provided and I pursued a dialog for clarification. In the one case where there was a response after many days of delay in response to my requests, specifically for Susanna, funds were sent about an hour after I got the email. That is called an action. When more information was requested on Gloria-Jane's gerbils and Zadok's bike, silence was offered. Where again should the "inaction" idea be placed?

As to "How's it working for you so far?!?", I must admit the greatest joy of the last 4½ years is that in the Lord's crushing of me, I have grown far closer to Him. My willingness to follow Him instead of seek worldly interests has grown greatly. Repentance on many things has been significant, but then again without dialog you wouldn't know, or do we lack the same reference?

The Lord has made it clear how much I must turn to Him, trust Him, and rely on Him rather than the world. I have asked the Lord for the opportunity to live that toward others and celebrate it in my daily life, and He said yes! It has been a joy! The glaring hole is obviously my family is being denied to me. My reaching out to them is ignored, but I continue in obedience to the Lord and to love at least those that my one day reach back.

Striving for obedience to the Lord, celebrating His gifts to me, trusting Him for my daily needs, seeking reconciliation with my wife, children, <u>and you</u>, is really working well for me. The Lord's grace is marvelous.

DJ,

Let's first remove the Asperger's question. It has been reviewed long ago and doesn't fit.

You are making statements but, like your dad, brother, and others, are refusing to communicate. This is most unfortunate for all of us, including our kids.

I realize that you will probably never see this, so I will be clear. As a follower of the Lord Jesus Christ, I will communicate with you, your dad, your brother, and our kids, openly and as clearly as I can in order to seek reconciliation <u>as the Lord commands</u>. It remains clear that I am the only one pursing this. I will continue as long as the Lord give me breath.

There is so much on the table, but if we are not following the same Lord we will never be able to truly communicate.

I have repented of many things, especially in being a cult member as opposed to a follower of Jesus. The PCA, like the Mormons, **is a cult**, and the shunning is the blatant evidence. As long as the institutional leadership, extended family, and you refuse to communicate, deal with Scripture, and follow the Lord's commands, especially in reference to reconciliation, we have no hope. I will pursue open communication and reconciliation to set the example. My hope remains in the Lord.

Some of our kids know that I am pursuing reconciliation. I am going to continue my effort to make them all aware that this is what the Lord requires. Please let us both do that! Anything else is not truly loving them.

What cruelty and hate does is to close the door of communications, lead our children on a path to follow the institution rather than the Lord, and prepare them for a hopeless existence. This is what your dad, your brother, and you are doing. Grace communicates. Grace offers forgiveness. Grace reconciles. The Lord has granted me the wonderful gift of not feeling revengeful toward your dad, brother or you, but a <u>willingness and desire for reconciliation</u> without retribution.

I will repeat that in time our kids will know this effort toward being obedient to the Lord was attempted. It is my hope they will be able to look back on how we both offered love and forgiveness to each other and reconciled. If instead they find that the institutions and family they are a part of rejecting reconciliation offers, will they not consider if the Lord's commands are simply suggestions since that is what they see. Will they have any reason to follow the Lord of Scripture? Please, let's set before them the love, grace, and reconciliation we see modeled in Scripture. Let's live it rather than just refuse to talk about it. This includes both Jim Crosses.

Please also note that the videos to you and our kids are focused on grace. Your husband still loves you. Our kid's dad still loves them.

I love you and our kids! Please remove the barrier between us.
