Greetings,

I'm in Tennessee and my wife is in North Carolina. I was just visited by a detective from the local sheriff's office who told me that I need to contact the sheriff's office in Davidson County, North Carolina. I was verbally warned to stop contacting my wife and the church in North Carolina. What weight this carries is still vague to me.

A call has been made to Detective Blake in North Carolina and thus far I left a voicemail.

Before this becomes clear or formalized, I want this known.

You can easily see from listening to the voicemails (<u>http://family.kozlowski.org/Voicemail</u>) that my effort is toward reconciliation. If you have any idea, would you let me know how pursuing reconciliation is harassment?

I have contended from Scripture and PCA doctrine, but does the leadership of Meadowview turn to the state to prevent the Scripture from being proclaimed rather than addressing the challenge before them?

The state's decree was to allow me to talk at least twice a week over the phone with my kids. This has not occurred in over a year. I have not turned to the state, but have repeatedly called to speak with my kids and to specifically speak of reconciliation. Should the followers of Christ now turn to the state to prevent me from doing what the state allows?

Can anyone point to anything that has been proclaimed by me that is untrue or is a misuse of Scripture from Scripture?

Can anyone point to why there is an exception in this case that alleged followers of the Lord Jesus Christ would ignore 1Co6 and use the state to prevent the Scripture from being proclaimed and reconciliation pursued?

I will cling to Christ and will pursue reconciliation with my wife, kids, father-in-law, and institutional church leadership for all the remaining days of my life. Anyone want to join me?

I would appreciate a response from you.

- 1. Do you want me to stop sending you emails, or do you want me to continue to send them to you?
- 2. Do you agree with my effort to reconcile, or can you point to anywhere in Scripture where this is wrong?
- 3. Do you have any advice that would be consistent with Scripture, which would be loving?
- 4. The details are still vague, as is the source of the appeal to the state. Do you want to know what happens?
