Zadok, you are the youngest of our kids and my last memory of you is when I put you in a car seat not knowing that you were being whisked away so that I would not see you again. While I know you are now eight, in my mind you are still that baby that was sleeping on my chest shortly before you were taken from me. We have missed a lot of time while you were going up. It remains my prayer that we don't have to miss anymore.
